STANDARD PRICING SCHEDULE: CCT
CUSTOM CONTRACT TARIFF

STATE OF OKLAHOMA

SERVICE TERRITORY: This tariff is available in all Oklahoma Gas and Electric Company (Company) service territories which are within the Oklahoma Corporation Commission's (OCC) jurisdiction.

AVAILABILITY: For all customers with a connected load of at least 250 kilowatts.

Nothing in this tariff obligates the Company to offer electric service to any customer on any basis other than under the applicable standard tariff.

ELIGIBILITY: The Company will determine eligibility for service under this tariff on a case-by-case basis.

To be eligible for this tariff, a customer must demonstrate (to the Company's satisfaction) that the customer is obtaining or can obtain its electric supply: (1) from an alternative supplier who is not rate-regulated by the Commission, or (2) from cogeneration or self-generation.

To be considered for service under this tariff, the customer must submit a written request. That request must include information which documents the customer's electrical supply alternatives. The Company reserves the right to request additional information, and the customer's failure to provide adequate information may result in a rejection of the request for service under this tariff.

NOTIFICATION: If, in addition to the alternative supplier who is not rate-regulated by the Commission, the customer indicates that it also has an alternative supplier who is rate-regulated by the Commission, the Company will notify the Commission-rate-regulated supplier that the Company intends to provide service under this tariff and has provided information regarding that service to the Commission's Public Utility Division Staff (PUD Staff).

SERVICE: Service shall be subject to the availability of metering and communication equipment. Service for all electric purposes required by the customer on the customer's premises and will be supplied at standard voltage(s). The Company shall determine the appropriate voltage(s) for delivery to the customer's premises. Service will be alternating current and delivered at approximately 60 hertz.

The Company will furnish service in accordance with the Company's Terms and Conditions of Service and the Rules and Regulations of the OCC.

The Agreement may provide the customer with services that are not currently available in the Company's standard tariffs. This tariff is not available for resale, supplementary, or backup service.

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ELECTRIC SERVICE AGREEMENT: After reviewing a customer's request for service and determining that a customer is eligible for service under this tariff, the Company may present an offer for services to the customer. The terms, conditions, quantities, prices, and types of service to be provided shall be documented within a written Electric Service Agreement. The Agreement must be signed by the customer, delivered to the Company, and submitted to the Commission for approval before service shall be provided. Unless otherwise specified by the Agreement, or unless otherwise ordered by the OCC, service shall begin approximately 30 days after execution of the Agreement.

AGREEMENT REVIEW: At least seven days (excluding holidays and Sundays) prior to the Agreement's effective date, the Company will provide a copy of the Agreement, along with documentation supporting the Agreement, to the PUD Staff. The supporting documentation shall be considered proprietary and shall be provided solely for the PUD Staff's review. As it is proprietary, the supporting documentation shall not be disclosed to the customer or any other person, entity, or organization. Those portions of the Agreement which are not required by Commission policy to be disclosed will also be considered proprietary and shall not be disclosed.

If the PUD Staff has not taken action to suspend the Agreement by its effective date, the Agreement shall be effective pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

AGREEMENT TERM: The Term of any Electric Service Agreement shall be subject to negotiation between the Company and the customer. Except as indicated below, Agreements executed pursuant to this tariff shall be for a period not to exceed ten years. Proposals to extend Agreements beyond ten years must be submitted to the OCC for approval.

PRICING OPTIONS: Service under this tariff shall be priced on a customer-by-customer basis pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Agreement. The final pricing arrangements between the Company and customer shall be included in the Agreement. The minimum price under this tariff shall be the Company's marginal energy cost appropriate for the term of the agreement. The maximum price under this tariff shall be the Company's standard tariff rate.

TERMINATION AND PENALTIES: The Electric Service Agreement may include provisions for canceling the Agreement. The Agreement may also provide for penalties for failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

CONFIDENTIALITY: Any customer receiving an offer for service under this tariff or taking service under this tariff shall not disclose to any person, entity, or organization, any information regarding the rate and rate methodology for such offer or service under this tariff, without the prior written consent of the Company. Disclosure of rate or rate methodology information (e.g. rate structure, rate calculations, rate analyses, and results) related to service or offers of service

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under this tariff shall result in a material breach of any Agreement between such consequential damages, and such disclosure shall, at the Company's sole option, result in the suspension of service under this tariff (with a full reimbursement to the Company by the customer of the difference between the applicable standard tariff rates and the rate provided pursuant to this tariff for all use billed pursuant to the Agreement) or prevent future offers of service under this tariff.

BILLING PROVISIONS AND ADJUSTMENTS:

Fuel Cost Adjustment: The rates, prices, and charges under this tariff may be exempt from adjustment under the provisions of the Company's Rider for Fuel Cost Adjustment. All kilowatt-hour sales and associated fuel costs under this tariff may be excluded from the Company's calculations for the Rider for Fuel Cost Adjustment.

Franchise Payment: When a municipality, by a franchise or other ordinance approved by the qualified electors of the municipality, levies or imposes upon the Company franchise payments or fees (based on a percent of gross revenues) to be paid by the Company to the municipality, such franchise payment will be added as a percentage of charges for electric service to the bills of all customers receiving service from the Company within the corporate limits of the municipality assessing said payment.

Annual Public Utility Assessment Fee: Bills rendered under this tariff shall include a charge levied pursuant to the Company's Rider for Annual Public Utility Assessment Fee.

Late Payment Charge: A late payment charge in an amount equal to 1.5 percent of the total balance for services and charges remaining unpaid on the due date stated on the bill shall be added to the amount due. The due date as stated on the bill shall be 20 days after the bill is issued.

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
