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EFFECTIVE IN: All territory served.

1.0 **AVAILABILITY:**

1.1 To any residential customer having a generating capacity of not more than twenty-five (25) kW, or any other industrial or commercial customer having a generation capacity of not more than three hundred (300) kW who take service under standard rate schedule(s) or any variations thereof, who has installed a net metering facility and signed a Standard Interconnection Agreement for Net Metering Facilities with the Utility. Such facilities must be located on the customer's premise and intended primarily to offset some or all of the customer's energy usage at the location.

The provisions of the customer's standard rate schedule are modified as specified herein.

1.2 Customers may not take service under this tariff and simultaneously take service under the provisions of any other alternative source generation or co-generation tariff.

2.0 **MONTHLY BILLING:**

2.1 On a monthly basis, the net metering customer shall be billed the charges applicable under the currently effective rate schedule and any appropriate rider schedules. Under net metering, only the kilowatt-hour (kWh) units of a customer's bill are affected.

2.2 If the electricity supplied by the electric utility exceeds the electricity generated by the net metering customer and fed back to the electric utility during the billing period, the net metering customer shall be billed for the net billable kWh supplied by the electric utility in accordance with the rates and charges under the Utility's rate schedule applicable to the customer.

2.3 If the electricity generated by the net-metering customer is fed back to the electric utility during the billing period and exceeds the electricity supplied by the electric utility, the utility shall credit the net-metering customer with any accumulated net excess generation in the next applicable

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billing period month to month until the close of an annual billing cycle, at which time any net excess generation credit shall expire. For customers who take service under a time-differentiated rate, accumulated net excess generation shall be accumulated separately by time period as defined by that schedule.

2.4 Any renewable energy credit created as the result of electricity supplied by a net-metering customer is the property of the net-metering customer that generated the renewable credit.
