

OGE Energy management values the democratic process and encourages its employees and other stakeholders to take an active interest in promoting principles of good government. Energy regulation and other public policy decisions can substantially impact OGE Energy, its customers and the communities it serves. The Company actively engages with government officials and participates in governmental processes to ensure the Company's interests and those of its customers are fairly considered. Engagement in the political process is always underscored by OGE Energy's commitment to lawfully promote open and honest interactions.

OGE Energy works to educate and inform public officials of the practical effects of their policy decisions. The Company strives to achieve legislative and regulatory outcomes that support affordability, reliability, grid strengthening and modernization initiatives.

Management strives to balance providing safe, reliable and affordable energy with creating long-term shareholder value and respecting the environment.

OGE Energy actively collaborates with policymakers to support effective regulation and legislation. The Company interacts with federal, state, and local governments on a wide array of energy issues affecting its service area and serves as a resource on industry trends. OGE shares insights with legislative and executive branch policymakers on energy generation and development, grid reliability and resiliency, economic development, regulation, and taxation.

Maintaining positive and constructive relationships with policymakers and their staff is essential. Lobbying constitutes an important method for OGE to engage in the democratic process, with employees and contract lobbyists directly interacting with members of Congress, state legislators, and regulatory authorities. OGE also lobbies indirectly through trade associations to educate the public on energy and utility issues that impact their communities.

While all OGE employees are effective advocates for conveying the Company's positive narrative, the government affairs team works closely with policymakers due to the significant impact of their decisions on customers, communities, and the Company.

The team also engages with U.S. regulatory agencies, including the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the Southwest Power Pool, the North American Electric Reliability Corporation, and the Environmental Protection Agency, as well as energy and electric regulatory authorities in the states where OGE operates.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR POLITICAL EXPENDITURES

- OGE Energy will comply with applicable laws, rules and regulations, including those addressing interaction with government officials.
- OGE Energy prohibits making any political expenditure in expectation of, acknowledgement of, or in response to an official act.
- OGE Energy will not directly or indirectly reimburse directors, employees or agents for personal political contributions or expenses.
- Political expenditures shall reflect OGE Energy's interests and not those of its individual officers or directors.
- OGE Energy will annually report corporate contributions to 527 organizations, including recipient names and the contribution amounts, on its website.
- OGE Energy is a member of several trade associations and chambers of commerce; some of which participate in the political process.
- OGE Energy engages in its communities and helps lead economic development initiatives, often through chambers of commerce and other 501(c)(6) entities.

- Although some chambers of commerce and trade associations may not completely align with the Company's political positions, management believes participation is important to promote the informed exchange of views and issues that impact the customers and communities we serve.
- Candidate values align with OGE Energy's, including transparency, integrity, respect, teamwork, public service and individual safety.
- Candidate champions legislative and regulatory policies and initiatives that support the best interest of the customers, communities and the Company.
- Candidate supports regulatory processes that are fair and reasonable for the Company's customers, communities and shareholders.
- The Vice President of Public and Regulatory Affairs coordinates with the Company's Chief Compliance Officer to ensure political expenditures and engagements with contract lobbyists are conducted lawfully and ethically.

CORPORATE POLITICAL EXPENDITURES

In certain circumstances, where permitted by law and with the approval of OGE Energy's Vice President of Public and Regulatory Affairs, the Company may use corporate funds to pay dues and expenditures to tax exempt organizations and trade associations which engage in political activities. These organizations are typically referred to as 501(c)(3), 501(c)(6) and 527 entities. The Company does not contribute to, or participate in other organizations, including 501(c)(4) entities, whose primary purpose is to support candidates for elected office, political parties, political action committees, or whose primary purpose is to fund political advertising, independent expenditures, or Super PACs.


OGE ENERGY CORP. EMPLOYEES' POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE ("OGE ENERGY PAC")

- OGE Energy encourages participation in the OGE Energy PAC. The PAC's 260 members voluntarily contribute to the employee-governed fund.
- OGE Energy PAC contributions are subject to regulatory limits and guided by its Articles of Association and actions of its steering committee.
- OGE Energy PAC contribution guidelines for federal and state
 offices are predicated on fair and reasonable legislative and
 regulatory processes and outcomes benefitting OGE Energy's
 customers, communities, and shareholders. Contributions are
 formula driven with consideration given to leadership positions
 and committee membership. Other considerations include
 assisting candidate committees through need-based criteria
 such as number of elections per cycle and debt elimination.













